Overview of the year

Our small, but very dedicated team was involved in many and various activities in 2019, despite the difficult times for protected areas and for all those who, until August 2018 were protected area managers.

Besides continuing the ongoing projects and organizing the Propark branded annual activities, like the Propark Adventure Race, the Protected Area Week and the annual protected area Gala, we decided to have more of our time dedicated to long term, practical conservation projects. Hence our commitment for active involvement in the conservation of the still existing wilderness areas in the Făgăraș Mountains and to start a truly participatory process, with active community engagement in informed debates about the establishment of a large national park in this area.

This year proved to be very challenging for capacity building activities: with no custodianship for protected area management as a result of the changes in the protected area governance system, imposed by the National Agency for National Protected areas, very few projects were still active and providing opportunities for training events.

We like to believe that we are capable to draw valuable lessons from the challenges faced in 2019 and to find new opportunities for the future of Propark.

Capacity Building Department

2019 was a very challenging year for pursuing our core mission, capacity building. Resources available for capacity building were very scarce, mainly because of the major changes imposed by the new National Agency for Natural Protected Areas. Many project activities in protected areas were put on hold or cancelled, including planned training events. Still, our trainers were continuing to transfer knowledge and develop skills related to protected area management and communication, community outreach, ecological networks, forest and agricultural land management, ecological footprint.

As part of this <u>LIFE Preparatory project</u> we have developed an online Training Needs Assessment Tool for Natura 2000 managers across Europe. Faithful to our mission, we are promoting through the tool a list of competences needed in the management of these biodiversity rich sites and we are encouraging them to learn about knowledge and skills they need to improve their job related performances.

Rediscover Romania Gala 2019 was the new brand under which we organized the 5th edition of the protected area gala, the only national event dedicated to protected area managers and nature conservationists in Romania. For the first time, representatives of the business sector were participating and learning about the rich and challenging work of people working nature conservation. The main aim of the gathering was to bring together these two sectors and to discuss about practical solutions for conservation in Romania. We launched at this event the Mentoring Programme for Nature, giving the start for joint work of the first six trainees and five mentors.

OUR STRATEGIC THEMES:

2. Model approaches for efficient PAs

Through this project, initiated by FCC, we aim to actively engage local communities in the process of creating a world-class wilderness reserve in the Southern Carpathians, large enough to allow natural processes to take place, to benefit biodiversity and local communities, and to serve as a model for a future National Park movement in Romania. We started with a rough stakeholder analysis carried out for the South-Eastern part of the Făgăraș Mountain range. This is but the first step in our long term commitment to contribute to the conservation of the still large tracks of wilderness areas in this region.

- 1 National Event called Fagaras Fest, organized in September with over 1000 participants

Assessment of the Ecotourism Destinations

2018-2019

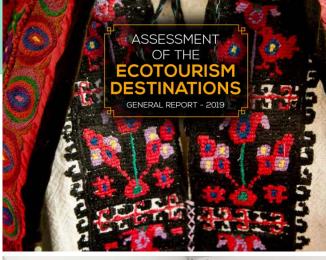
The assesment documented by the ProPark team presents the current state of development and management of seven Ecoturism Destinations: Bison Land (Ținutul Zimbrului), Pădurea Craiului, Eco Maramureș, Băile Tușnad and the surroundings, Țara Hațegului Retezat, Țara Dornelor and the Transylvanian Highlands (Colinele Transilvaniei). Hopefully our assessment report will contribute to the design of future grants and projects for developing the contribution of the tourism sector to nature conservation.

Natura 2000 Management Guidelines for Montenegro

2019

The Delegation of the European Union to Montenegro commissioned us to prepare management guidelines for the management of the future Natura 2000 sites. During two intense work-periods in Montenegro, after learning about the protected area system and interacting with various stakeholders, we prepared guidelines with a very practical approach to site management, building on our experience in Natura 2000 management planning and protected area management.

OUR STRATEGIC THEMES:

3. Education and awareness raising

The aim of the project was to develop innovative and transferable educational materials regarding the conservation, awareness and acceptance of large carnivores in Europe. These materials were tested through educational projects about achieving compatibility between wildlife and human activities. The group of young people, playing roles as future decision makers, had the opportunity to meet and discuss with foresters, farmers, hunters, biologists, to learn about their work and about their actions that are influencing the habitats and the populations of large carnivores.

Richita environment field educational centre

We have now the chance to contribute to a new nature education initiative, the establishment of the Richita Educational Centre, a model environmental learning resource for children, teachers and researchers in Romania planned and built by FCC. Our role is to develop the programme for this centre, hence in 2019 we started the strategic plan, aiming for a programme that will foster understanding and love for the natural world and will help maintain a sense of pride and understanding amongst the members of local communities regarding the values that they still poses in their region.

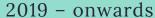

Wild Kingdome education initiative

The Wild Kingdom initiative of the TENT is present since 2013 in Romania with two mobile education units, i.e. two double decker buses, serving as moving "education rooms" for school children of rural Romania, teaching them about the importance of protecting the last untouched forests of Europe. In September 2019 the double-deckers and the programme brand was donated to Propark. We started to develop a plan for a mobile educational centre and the associated nature education programme and started to transform the still functional double decker for the programme.

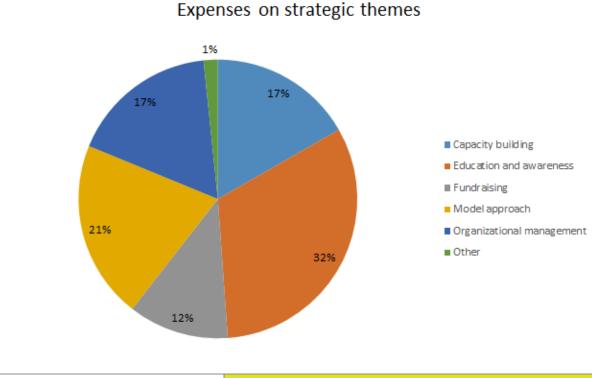

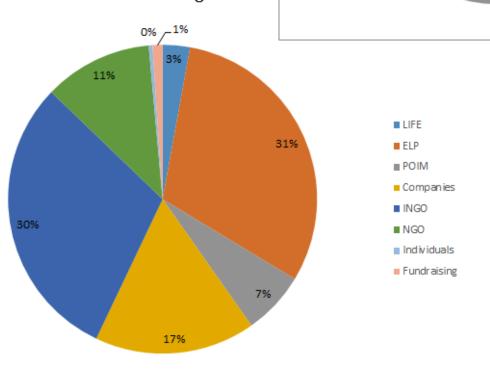
